


Message from Swavek

It is incredible how quickly the spring term went and it's time again to share with you Fiveways' news and achievements.




Below you will find data for the whole school, but we also have analysis by individual classes, which we will soon upload onto the school website.

Curriculum presentation



TEN TORS **2023**


28th-30th April



Sensory Integration Virtual Coffee Morning

Rob Kirkwood is a specialist Occupational Therapist and Sensory Integration Practitioner supporting Fiveways with consultation and advice to help our students in school. From a sensory point of view, schools can be very rich but also sometimes challenging places for children and young people.

We have been using Rob's experience with sensory processing and regulation to support classes with strategies for meeting sensory needs and maintaining better sensory and emotional regulation in school. We recognise that home life can be equally as rich and challenging so we we wanted to offer an opportunity for parents to bring their questions to Rob in an informal/relaxed coffee morning style virtual group.

The Rainbow Hall was turned into a Science Lab where we enjoyed experimenting with bath bombs, Oobleck (cornflour mix), bubbles, coloured test tubes and volcanoes. This half term, Class 3 have been making all different kinds of soups. They have been practising their chopping skills and learning the different ways to chop lots of different vegetables. This half term we have been talking about emotions through the use of the story of The Highway Rat. We have been exploring our emotions and trying to say when we are feeling a certain way.

The students have been working hard on asking and paying for items at the Hub café and have progressed incredibly well.

We have been talking about growing up and the changes to our bodies as we grow.







For over 18 months a working group from Fiveways sixth form have been uncovering the external boundary wall of the Iron Age wall at Ham Hill Country Park. The stones are of great interest to the National Geological Society because of the clearly defined layering. The Rangers gifted us with a plaque on the wall to recognise the hard work and achievement of the learners. We are really hoping to develop the area so that it becomes a really lovely place to sit and picnic.







We have completed our Spring AQA on sustainability! We have learnt about keeping our beaches clean and have taken part in litter picking activities at local beaches. Staying with our beach theme we worked together to create a brand new 6th form Ocean Tac Pac which involves pieces of sea themed music paired up with different sensory actions involving sea sprays, bags of shells and water bubble blowing. We worked incredibly hard to host a group of 25 school leaders who attended the training centre. From meeting and greeting the visitors, performing a song about being 'Unstoppable', delivering speeches on what we want for our futures and cooking and serving a delicious lunch, the 6th formers were incredible and the visitors all gave impressive feedback and thanked them for such a wonderful day. As part of our PfA curriculum some of our learners have begun new work experience placements at The Lords Larder and a local charity shop and we've also had visits to Yeovil and Strode colleges.
