

Dear Parents and Carers,


Another academic year has gone by and as always, throughout the year we have been supporting all pupils to achieve the best academic and social outcomes. Over last year we had seen so many pupils blossom and grow. A good example is the 6th Form leavers. Out of 4 leavers 3 will be going to mainstream colleges in September 2023. This is a great achievement for those pupils and their families. As part of our ongoing commitment to link with external education and adulthood providers we have made more contacts with local colleges including Strode college. Some of this year's leavers have been offered places in Strode college.

Attendance

I would like to thank you, yet again, for your support with rising pupil attendance. As you will see from the graph below, this year we have reached the highest attendance in the last 4 years. We hope to increase this percentage further next year. There is clear evidence of pupil's progress and attendance, and this is why attendance remains high on our agenda. As always, we do understand that for some pupils attendance is affected by medical conditions etc.

Ofsted Inspection

I hope that by now all of you will have had the opportunity to read the Ofsted report. Thank you for those of you who provided exceptionally good feedback to the Lead Inspector about the school and your child's experiences of education.

We are now working on developing and securing further our phase 5 aspect of the curriculum to continue to enable all pupils to achieve through stretch and challenge.

Family App

Fiveways school uses the online and App version of Evidence for Learning (EfL). This allows teaching staff to capture evidence daily of pupil's progress against Personal Learning Goals (PLGs). The evidence of progress is captured in a number of forms including video, photo, completed piece of work and annotation. It is an excellent way to see how well pupils are making achievement and progress towards their PLGs over time. From mid-September all parents and carers will be given access to EfL family App. You will be able to see the PLGs the pupils are working towards and how the school evidence their progress. You will also be able to comment on the evidence that you see. In addition, you will be able to upload evidence of your child's progress and achievements when the pupils are not in school. This will support the evidence on how well the pupils apply their skills in any settings.

Sam Ensor, Deputy Headteacher, is leading on this project and in the near future you will hear from Sam regarding next steps. There is currently a trial underway with a small number of parents to get feedback in preparation for the roll out.

The feedback so far is very good including "Marvellous!", "It creates a bridge between the school and parents" "We can see first-hand ... and hopefully as parents we can reinforce these within the home".

School further growth and new staff

In September we will start with 98 pupils which is the most we have ever had. The demands for school places are growing but we have limited spaces that we can offer. If the current number of consultations (pupils referred to us) continues over the summer holiday, we may increase the school numbers to 100 in January 2024. Due to the opening of a new class last year we have the capacity to do so without increasing number of pupils in each class. The biggest class that we will have will be the 6th Form, which from September will reach 13 pupils. Due to the nature of the 6th Form this number will not prevent all pupils from having an outstanding education offering and should support developing additional skills such as teamwork, collaboration and accepting others.

As a result of this growth, from September 2023, we needed to contract more staff. The new staff members include 6th Form teachers, Lower School teacher, 8 TAs, 2 Supply TAs and a member of the admin team. In the Autumn term newsletter, we will include their photographs. No doubt they will introduce themselves to you when you visit the school. Due to a number of staff going on maternity leave in the Autumn term we will advertise for further staff to work with us for a fixed term.

I wish you, your children, and your family a good summer break and I look forward to welcoming all pupils back to school on Thursday 7th September 2023.

Safeguarding children and young people

through the school holidays

What is safeguarding?

Ensures that every child, regardless of their age, disability, gender reassignment, race, religion or belief, sex, or sexual orientation, has a right to equal protection from harm. Safeguarding is the steps that people take to protect children and vulnerable people from harm.

Examples of safeguarding concerns to look out for:

Physical

A group of children start pushing or hitting a smaller child when an adult is not looking

Emotional

You see a crying child run towards their parent who responds in a harsh manner using inappropriate language

Sexual

A teenage girl walking home is catcalled and harassed, or being touched without consent

Neglect

You see a child wearing the same dirty clothes every day and who steals food from other children






The above reading scheme runs through the holidays, the children need to share/read/listen (talking books) to 6 in total to get a certificate and a medal.





















Class 3
