## "The Storm"

This term Bamboozle theatre group visited Fiveways to perform "The Storm". Not all pupils could attend so it was offered for those pupils who had not experienced the group before and hadn't experienced the pantomime at Christmas. A big thank you to FofFSA for helping with the funding of this amazing experience.

The show is carefully designed for children and young people with autism and learning disabilities, to put them at ease, give them space and time to move freely and experience the show in their own way. Using elements of Shakespeare's "The Tempest" and a limited amount of Shakespeare's language, Storm tells a dramatic story of the sea, ships, islands and magic. Pupils were welcomed into the performance space with relaxing music and during the performance were invited to interact with the actors and the setting.

The pupil reactions and a few words from the supporting staff tell you just what a wonderful emotional experience it was!

Immersive Amazing Engaging Responsive Inclusive Interactive

The expertise the Bamboozle team have to connect and engage our pupils and sustain their attention and rapture for 45 minutes was beautiful to see. The music, lighting, props and script are only the support materials - the real gem is the marvellous Intensive Interaction they bring throughout their performance that brings with it joy and delight. It was truly wonderful.





Gems Class have been exploring different types of weather through dance, music, art and sensory exploration. We have had lots of fun exploring weather through shaving foam clouds, muddy footprints and splashing in puddles with our wellies! We enjoyed our bucket session by sitting under an umbrella and watching and hearing the raindrops.

We have been incredibly lucky as the weather has helped us deliver the different weather!

The children have been exploring number and heavy and light objects in Numeracy. We have been listening to poems, reading stories with sensory elements and singing lots of songs all relating to the weather. We're super weather experts now!









In Buttons this term our topic is weather and seasons. Looking into different activities we might do in each season. Cycling when the weather is hot, splashing in the water when the weather is wet and wrapping up warm for snowball fights when it is cold. In phonics we have continued to explore sounds and our knowledge of what makes each sound. Our favourites including the elephant, helicopter and pouring water. In maths, alongside our usual number songs and Attention Autism we have begun to explore "big and small" as well as moving on to "light and heavy". really enjoying exploring using the bucket scales to investigate which things are light and which are heavy. Whilst swimming is a consistent form of move that we engage in each week we have also been experiencing dance in our PE sessions. Starting with a warm up song, then having a go at a dance with some specific moves (clapping, stomping, etc.) before then ending with a silly song which always leaves us in stitches. In our creative times we have continued to explore the seasons and what might grow in the spring. As a result of this we have been planting a lot of seeds to later plant in the woodland walk. A great start to 2024 from Buttons and we can't wait to see what will happen next half term.





This term in Acorns we have had so much fun exploring our weather topic. We learnt a weather poem and signs and have been creative making lots of weather artwork. Our multisensory weather story has involved shaving foam snow, rain sticks, thunder drumming, rainbow streamers and a very blowy wind machine! On Mondays, pupils have become budding scientists. Our favourite experiments have been 'storm in a jar', 'magic rain milk', 'expanding hot air ballons' and 'fizzy rainbow volcanoes'.











Shells have been busy exploring different science experiments during our bucket sessions based on weather. They enjoyed the volcano exploding and rainbow rain. We have had fun in Art lessons making a weather mobile and exploring different weather conditions. In cookery, the children have been learning how to make a sandwich and trying some new fillings. In maths, we have been exploring different prepositions. The children enjoyed using their preposition knowledge in the classroom and on the adventure playground.







# **Feathers**



This half term in Feathers, we have been learning about the weather in its different forms. We have been working hard creating weather journals throughout the weeks and have had fun getting our hands in and getting messy. We have also been learning to share our emotions throughout the day with a focus of this being in circle time which has been really interesting for everyone.









We made pizzas on Tuesday, and we touched food as hot and cold, we discovered how materials work! How we made the tiffin's hot and cold, we also looked at water, and we also discovered how we made a water dam to stop water coming out the end. We had to use different materials, to see what one stopped the water. Written by the students of class 1.











We used a switch to make a fan and hairdryer work and enjoyed Hot Chocolate and ice-cream. YUM! We went to hot and cold places in the discovery Room and Painted Hot and Cold colour pictures.




























We sorted wet and dry objects that we found in the woodland walk and made Vegetable soup and toast for snack AND had hot chocolate and biscuits! Yum again!

















This term Class 3 went on a class trip to Ninesprings to explore our theme of wet and dry. We had a lovely walk up to the pond, splashing in puddles then even stopped off at the cafe for a slice of cake.









This term we have been taking trips to the shops. The pupils have been buying different items each week and learning how to exchange money.

Some of the items bought have been for our sensory cooking. They have tried sweet jelly and sour lemon; the tasting of the lemon produced some interesting facial expressions. Plus, soft cottage cheese which wasn't liked much, but crunchy crisps were a hit!

We had a theatre company, Bamboozle, in school recently. It was fabulous and all the pupils enjoyed the experience, with great participation from them all.

There was also a visit from the Police, the students were able to sit inside and press the button for the siren, they loved it.















Class 5 have had a brilliant half term. They have enjoyed sensory exploring for our literacy topic of materials. They have been exploring hot and cold, wet and dry, soft and hard and have enjoyed creating our own non-fiction class book putting together what we have found out about the different materials.

Class 5 have also been putting their independent living skills into practice by going on weekly trips to the shop and cooking a variety of different things including pizza and biscuits.

Their enterprise task this half term was to make, prepare and sell cream teas to the Fiveways staff, we hope they enjoyed them. The money raised from this will go towards a special lunch trip during the last week of half term.









During this ½ term the 6th form learners have been busy working on their AQA units, discussing the emergency services and talking about values and culture. The learners are also planning an afternoon tea, as part of the AQA unit working as a group to plan an afternoon event, look out for invitations coming out soon. Some learners have also been having hand massages as part of their taking part in a hand massage unit.





The learners have also started to learn about what to do in an emergency as part of First Aid which they are undertaking as the skill element of their Duke of Edinburgh award and have also started littering picking at Ninesprings for the volunteering element of the Duke of Edinburgh. Hopefully the weather will be kinder to us next ½ term and we can get out walking to practice for the physical element of the award.
